The <u>"Best Practices in Jesuit Higher Education Project"</u> is a global initiative of the International Association of Jesuit Universities (IAJU), intending to collect and share quality content on best practices *and* know-how of our institutions. In addition to promote academic collaboration, encourage reflection, and identify strategic colleagues in common areas and themes.
